Courtesy of the ARRL we have three very nice door prizes that will be awarded during the afternoon session. You won't need to be present, but you do need to be registered to win! One of the door prizes each year is linked to the number of entries submitted for the ARRL VHF contests, so always make it a point to participate and send in a log!

Antenna Gain Measurements

Weather permitting, we have the ability to test antennas on bands from 2 meters through 24 GHz. This is a great chance to see if your homebrew antenna is really as good as you think it is, or to check out the specs on a commercial antenna. Results from previous years can be found on the NLRs web page. If there is rain, or standing water, measuring will not take place.

We are also asking that you let us know what antennas you are bringing. Please note the following:

We cannot test 6m antennas... sorry. The test frequencies are: 144.2; 222.1; 432.1; 902.1; 1296.1; 2304.1; 3465.1; 5760.1; 10368; 24GHz. Frequencies other than these may not be available due to lack of sources or calibrated reference antennas (i.e., can't accurately test 146 or 446 as the reference antenna hasn't been calibrated there). In general, we do NOT do "tweaking" or adjustments; we measure.

As soon after 9AM as we can get started, we start with 2m on the VHF range and 2304MHz on the microwave range. We work our way UP the bands. (Sometimes we can run the two ranges at the same time: VHF (2m - 1296) and microwave (2304MHz to 10GHz). Sometimes we cannot.) Remember, you are expected to participate in the testing: getting the antenna on the test pole, holding it, taking it off, etc. Your help makes everything run faster and allows us to measure more antennas in the limited time we have available.

ARRL Awards QSL Card Checking

Card checking for all ARRL awards DC to Light will be available at **Aurora '19**. Mike, WØVTT, is authorized as a card checker for VUCC and ARRL HF awards (DXCC including 160M) and has volunteered to check cards at the conference. Donn, WA2VOI, is also often available to check cards for VUCC at the monthly breakfast. In either case, be sure to have the current forms filled out, cards sorted, fees, and a stamped envelope to forward your application to ARRL.

At Aurora '19, card checking for VUCC and all other ARRL awards will be available from noon until 3:00 PM near the registration table. The ARRL field checking program provides League members the opportunity to have QSL cards for all ARRL awards checked locally without having to mail their cards to League headquarters in Newington. Mike Cizek, WØVTT, of St Charles MN is a DXCC Card Checker and is eligible to check cards for all ARRL awards: DXCC, VUCC, WAC and WAS.


NLRS Breakfasts
